The meeting was called to order by Tee Price. A motion was made by Ervin Best to accept the minutes as presented. Greg Hopkins seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The purpose of today's called meeting is to discuss the Non-UCR monies allotted to Rockingham County for fiscal year 2006-2007. The recommendations of this meeting will be presented at the Executive Committee meeting next week, which will be attended by Tee Price and Ann Brady.

A. Crisis care to prevent institutionalization.

Questions include limitation on number of days a client is allowed to stay, definition of "crisis" and is the bed specifically for at-risk clients or for all clients. The question was raised on two options, 1) to have a provider who will have a bed dedicated for crisis clients only or, 2) to have a list of providers who would be willing to provide a bed for crisis. For example call the first provider on the list and if they don't have a bed, call the next provider on the list, etc.

Discussion was held on the Request for Proposal (RFP). Several changes were recommended on the RFP draft. Question was raised on the target population definitions. They are as follows:

CMSEDChild mental health seriously & emotional disturbed with out of home placement
CMMEDChild mental health moderately & emotional disturbed without out of home placement
CMDEFChild mental health deaf or hard of hearing
CMPATChild mental health homeless
CMECDChild mental health early childhood disorder
CSSADChild with Substance Abuse Disorder
CSWOMChild Substance Abuse Women
CSCJOChild Substance Abuse Criminal Justice Offender
CSMAJChild in the MAJORS program, substance abuse & juvenile justice

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- B. Comprehensive services and family supports.
1. These funds are set aside to provide residential placement for clients who are not eligible for Medicaid, Health Choice, IPRS, etc. The recommended amount will stay at \$15,000.
 2. This specifically set aside for a client who has a change in billing status and has nothing to cover the placement. A reduction in these funds was recommended, from \$2,516 to \$1800.00. The balance will be transferred to the Crisis Care.
- C. Family/youth participation and...
1. Peer support group/teen connection - \$7, 200.00
 2. Family Support Group - \$2,000.00
 3. Client scholarships - \$3,000.00; which shows a reduction from last year. The difference of \$4, 500.00 will be transferred to crisis care.
 4. Transportation for NA/AA activities – 200.00
- The difference will be distributed to other requests.
- D. Community and family/youth training on System of Care...
1. Rockingham County Community Collaborative - \$2,000.00
 2. Parents SOC training - \$500.00 The reduction from last year's request will be carried over to the Crisis Care, \$1, 300.00
- G. Prevention and early intervention activities...
1. Youth Services Program – SAS/Ladybugs (prevention) \$10,000
 2. Possible behavior supports – NC Schools \$2,000
 3. Juvenile Justice – summer component for residential clients.
